Initially partnering with the Minnesota Community Foundation, MACF's volunteer advisory board

worked tirelessly to create an organization that would inspire not only their

generation, but future generations, to give back and grow their community. In late 2012, the group partnered with the Southwest Initiative Foundation (SWIF), and became a community fund under SWIF's guidance. Working with SWIF has opened many new doors for MACF, who provides many services, including technical assistance, to ensure MACF's success.

Rising to a Challenge

William Frederick Halsey, Jr. said, "There are no great people in this world, only great challenges which ordinary people rise to meet."

2014 was our first full year with the Southwest Initiative Foundation (SWIF). One of the first items of business was a challenge by SWIF to the Montevideo Area Community Foundation (MACF) to raise \$25,000.00 which they would match. I think most of the Advisory Committee members felt a twinge of apprehension and they were thinking "hey no one mentioned anything about having to raise money!" One of the first items of business was to formulate a plan. We divided ourselves into four teams, and implemented something similar to the NFL draft. Each team drafted area businesses to personally meet with, to explain who and what the Foundation does, and to ask for a donation.

Those apprehensions quickly faded as we were able to reach our goal of \$25,000.00 in almost record time.

Because we were able to reach our goal so swiftly, we were challenged once again by a group of Montevideo individuals to raise another \$25,000.00 which they would match. I will be honest, we were once again apprehensive but, we had done so well with the first match, we found we also had a great deal of determination in knowing that we could do this.

Over the past twenty years, the MACF was able to raise \$100,000.00. Last year alone we raised \$100,000.00 and effectively doubled our endowment. What does this

ENDOWMENT REPORT

This past year has been an *incredible* experience for the Montevideo Area Community Foundation as our Endowment Fund grew by over \$100,000 in 2014, first stimulated by a \$25,000 challenge grant from the Southwest Initiative Foundation, which, amazingly, was quickly matched. Then, three local business people offered another \$25,000 challenge. That, too, was successfully met thanks to wonderful community support. The growth of the Endowment Fund will enable us to nearly double the amount we award in grants each year. Endowment Fund balance as of March 31, 2015 is \$200,749.

In December at our annual grant event during Business After Hours (BAH) at The Crossings. A total of \$10,725 in grants were awarded, including:




- \$5,000 to adapt a vehicle and increase riding options for people with limited mobility
- \$1,800 to provide food for low-income students in our community
- \$1,500 to help build the disc golf course in Chinhinta Park
- \$1,125 to develop a family center at the Chippewa County Fair
- \$1,000 to purchase hot and cold reusable trays for home-delivered meals
- \$300 for a bowling event for youth and their mentors to build strong, trusting relationships

And that's in addition to a special grant of \$9,500 we awarded earlier in 2014 to support the new Sanford toddler adapted playground!

Here's another number you can feel proud to be a part of: \$116,297. That's the total amount in grants the Montevideo Area Community Foundation has reinvested in our community since 2003.

GRANTS



Donations given to the Montevideo Area Community Foundation are placed into endowment funds. A portion of the interest from these endowment funds are distrusted every year to various programs and organizations via grants.

The foundation supports the areas of arts and humanities, community and civic affairs, education, historic preservation, health and human services, social economic affairs, and environmental conservation. Grants may only be awarded to recognized 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations or to government agencies. However, grants are given to all areas of the community.

Deferred Gifts



Jerry Tilden: A Community Man

“Time is the greatest gift one can give” is perhaps the greatest understatement one can say when it comes to Jerry and Dixie Tilden. Both Jerry and Dixie have given thousands of hours of their time not only to Montevideo, but to the region as well.

Jerry Tilden was born on January 22, 1942 in Sioux Falls, SD to Jack and Genevieve Tilden. Jerry has four brothers, Dennis, Larry, Randy, and Terry, and one sister Roxanne. He graduated from Washington High School in Sioux Falls in 1959, and married the love of his life Dixie Utesch on November 24, 1963. Two children were born to this union, Bret (wife Angie) who lives in Montevideo and currently works for SpecSys in Granite Falls; and Julie (husband Keith) who lives in Dayton, MN, and is an event planner in the Metro area. They are blessed with eight grandchildren, Brittany, Sarah, Chelsea, Justin, Jaden, Ashley, Taylor, and Kaylee. For the past several years, Jerry has worked as a realtor at Kuhlmann Real Estate. He never could find time for retirement!

Both Jerry and Dixie have been greatly involved in our community and region since 1973. Jerry is the past president and board member of Brookside Senior Living Board of Directors, he served as a member of the Montevideo Area Community Foundation Advisory Committee, and he is a

member of the Montevideo Lions Club. He is the Past President and current member of the Fiesta City Flora Society, Past President and Treasurer of the District 10 Garden Club, and he also served on the Board of Advisors for the West Central Research Center in Morris, MN. Additionally, he was Co-Chairman of the Montevideo Community Playground build in Smith Park. He has been a Master Gardener since 2006, is a past Board member of the State Master Gardener Advisory Board, and also served on the Montevideo City Park Board. Jerry was a mentor for Circle Sentencing, Past President of the Montevideo Chamber of Commerce, and he was a past officer of the Montevideo Jaycees.

Jerry has been very active in the Chippewa County Historical Society as well. In the summer of 2008, he asked about restarting the Historical Society’s Endowment Fund which



had stood at less than \$600.00 since its inception in 1992. By the end of 2008, the Historical Society’s Endowment Fund increased to \$18,000.00! By April 30, 2015, their Fund has increased to over \$211,000.00! All of this under Jerry’s tutelage! The Society’s Endowment Funds are a part of the family of funds of the Montevideo Area Community Foundation. When Jerry became ill last October, discussion was held about beginning a named Endowment Fund to honor all that he has done for the Chippewa County Historical Society and the Society’s Endowment Fund. To recognize this, a new fund was begun, The Founders Fund – In Honor
